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# Message from the Vice-Chancellor

With this high held spirit, I welcome you all to the Rabindranath Tagore University, which was established by upgrading Hojai College in accordance with ASSAM ACT NO. XXXIV of 2017.

I feel pleased to inform that the institution has successfully completed its five-year journey and is gradually strengthening its position as the state's premier institution. With the utmost seriousness, our committed faculty members and staff are performing their duties.

The passion of our students for studying and their involvement in extracurricular and academic activities add to our institution's overall success. The Assam government has awarded fellowships to two postgraduate students studying in the Botany department, while one postgraduate student in Chemistry has been chosen for FAST–SF–2024. As a result, I can promise you that the university premises will be lively and enjoyable.

Since the university is still in its early stages, its infrastructure constantly developing. Right now, we have eight postgraduate courses and fifteen undergraduate courses available. Additionally, Ph.D. programs have begun in ten different academic departments within our university. To assist us in our development attempts, the government has been giving us funds as well as guidance. From the academic year 2023–2024, we effectively implemented the National Education Policy (NEP). We have prepared our own course curriculum aligning with the NEP 2020. Eighteen new faculty members have been recruited, of whom thirteen are assistant professors, three associate professors, and two professors. The university's reputation is being enhanced by the efforts of both new and experienced educators. Two of the faculties were selected for the prestigious INSA fellowship.

We host a variety of events, including faculty development programs, national level seminars and Workshops, National Science Day etc. The awareness programme relating to plasma, the fourth state of matter, organized in collaboration with the Institute for Plasma Research (IPR), Gujarat in the month of March, 2024, was very much successful. The students' initiative in planning cleanup campaigns both on and off campus is a shining example of their feeling of civic duty and responsibility. In my opinion, in addition to the regular curriculum, co-curricular and extracurricular activities help kids develop holistically by encouraging critical thinking, problem-solving abilities, effective communication, teamwork, and a sense of sportsmanship.

On April 8, 2024, we magnificently staged the first Rabindranath Tagore University convocation, during which 1124 students were awarded qualifying degrees. The occasion was graced by the hon'ble chancellor of the institution, Sri Gulab Chand Kataria. Dr. Virendra Mani Tiwari, Director of NEIST, Jorhat was present as the chief guest. We presented two gold medals to the top students in the PG science stream and the PG arts stream.

Our goal is to elevate RTU to the status of a preeminent institution that will be distinguished not just by its extracurricular and academic offerings but also by its ability to embody the spirit of Indian culture and values. Furthermore, we must remember that just as a clean and green campus better fosters a free and fresh mind, so does a well-resourced infrastructure support learning. I shall try my best to make a difference and continue the legacy of the Hojai College through this journey. We shall stand by the motto of equality and equity towards all categories of gender, class, caste, creed, religion and race. #### New Education Policy 2020 and its implementation

Our government paved the way for transformative reform in school and higher education system by launching the New National Education Policy (NEP) on 29th July 2020. The Committee for Draft National Education Policy headed by Dr. K. Kasturirangan submitted its report on May 31, 2019. The Committee was constituted by the Ministry of Human Resource Development in June 2017. The draft Policy provides for reforms at all levels of education from school to higher education. It seeks to increase the focus on early childhood care, reform the current exam system, strengthen teacher training, and restructure the education regulatory framework. It also seeks to set up a National Education Commission, increase public investment in education, strengthen the use of technology and increase focus on vocational and adult education, among others.

In accordance with the NEP 2020, the UGC has formulated a new student-centric "Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (CCFUP)" incorporating a flexible choice-based credit system, multidisciplinary approach, and multiple entry and exit options. This will facilitate students to pursue their career path by choosing the subject/field of their interest.

Accordingly, the Rabindranath Tagore University has adopted Four Year under graduate Course curriculum Framework (FYUGCF) under New Education Policy, 2020 to be implemented from August, 2023. It is a structure for four-year under Graduate programmes in different disciplines with multiple exit options.

### **Outline of Courses**

The categories of courses and requirement of minimum credits for 4-year degree as per UGC are as follows:

1. Major/Core (DSC) : 80 Credits

2. Minor/DSE : 32 Credits

3. Multidisciplinary (GE) : 9 Credits

4. Ability Enhancement Course : 8 Credits

5. Skill Enhancement Course : 9 Credits

6. Value Added Course : 8 Credits

7. Summer Internship : 2 Credits

8. Dissertation/Research project : 12 Credits

Students on exit shall be awarded Bachelor of (in the field of study/discipline) Honours/Honours with Research after securing the requisite 160 credits on completion of semester VIII

Student opts to exit after completion of 1st year securing 40 credits s/he may be awarded a UG Certificate,

if s/he completed one vocational course of 4 credits during summer vacation of first year.

- 2. Student opts to exit after completion of 2nd year securing 80 credits s/he may be awarded a UG Diploma, if s/he completed one vocational course of 4 credits during summer vacation of second year.
- 3. Student opts to exit after completion of either 1st year or completion of 2nd year may be allowed to re-enter within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.
- 4. Student opts to exit after completion of third year securing 120 credits will be eligible for UG degree with Major discipline without Honours.

- 5. For 4-year Honours degree the major subject/discipline requires 80 credits and the minor subject/discipline requires 32 credits. The student who exits after completion of 6th Semester/3rd Year, s/he requires 60 credits in the major subject/discipline and 24 credits in the minor subject/discipline.
- 6. Students who intend to complete four year degree programme will have two options in 7th and 8th semester as:
- i) Students who choose Research in 4th year are to study DSC-16, DSC-17, and DSC-18 of 4 credits each and to complete a dissertation/project of 4 credits mandatorily in 7th semester.

Accordingly, in 8th semester these students will study DSC-19, DSC-20 of 4 credits each and to complete a dissertation/project of 8 credits.

- ii) Students who don't choose Research will study DSC-21\*, DSC-22\*, DSC-23\* mandatorily in lieu of dissertation/project in 7th and 8th semester in addition to (DSC-16 to DSC-20) leading to Honours without Research.
- 7. Students who completed four-year degree programme with dissertation/project will be awarded Bachelor Degree of Honours with Research. And students who completed four year degree without dissertation/project will be awarded Bachelor Degree of Honours.

# **Choosing of Courses/Papers**

The students seeking for admission into B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. programmes are to choose the course/papers as per following guidelines. The students will choose minor, multidisciplinary, SEC, AECC and VAC papers on the basis of Core paper they opted. The details of basket/ grouping are made for B.A, B.Sc. and B.com as below.

#### 1. AECC

The students will choose AECC paper, viz. Assamese or Bengali or Hindi or English language proficiency which is not related to his/her core paper. For example, a student having major in Assamese he/she cannot opt Assamese paper as MIL. Similarly, an English major student cannot opt the English proficiency language.

#### **CREDITS AND ATTENDANCE**

**Students must have at least 75% attendance**. If a student fails to secure the necessary credit in the 1<sup>st</sup> semester or subsequent semesters (i.e. attendance below prescribed norms) he/she will not be allowed to sit in the *end semester* examination and must repeat the first and subsequent semesters to earn deficit credit (attendance) only after successful completion of the 6<sup>th</sup> Semester.

#### **EXAMINATION SYSTEM**

Apart from the *end semester examinations* conducted by the University, there will be periodical *in – semester examinations* (Sessional Examinations/class tests/etc.) as per university academic calendar. **Appearance in both the type of the examinations is compulsory**.

In case a student fails in any one or more papers in an *end semester* examination, he/she can reappear in all those papers with few restrictions. The university will notify these restrictions very soon.

A student can appear for betterment in any one of the major theory papers in the next similar examination if he/she secures pass marks in all papers. No betterment will be allowed in internal and practical examinations in any semester.

A student must pass all his/her semester examinations, including arrear and betterment, within **six** academic sessions. Appearing as private candidate is out of the scope present system.

#### **INTERNAL ASSESSMENT**

Internal Assessment will account for 20% of the total marks allotted to a particular course.

#### **END SEMESTER EXAMINATION**

The end – semester examination will be of 80% of the total marks allotted for a particular course. The end – semester examination shall be of 3 hours duration for a course of total marks exceeding 50. For a student to pass in a course, he/she has to pass in both Internal Assessment and end – semester examination separately.

#### FEE STRUCTURE

#### I. Admission Fee:

The total fee to be paid for admission into UG 1<sup>st</sup> Year classes will be notified in the university website (<a href="https://rtuassam.ac.in">https://rtuassam.ac.in</a>) before admission.

#### II. Hostel Fee:

Admission : Rs. 1, 200/-

Caution money : Rs. 1, 000/- (Refundable)

Monthly seat rent : Rs. 1, 500/-

Upon selection, an applicant is required to pay the seat rent of three months in advance that is Rs. 4, 500/-, at the time of admission.

#### ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Admission into the RTU will be via SAMARTH portal and in order of merit. A merit list of candidates will be prepared and displayed in both university website and SAMARTH portal. <u>Candidates are advised to check admission related updates on the university website (https://rtuassam.ac.in/) regularly.</u>

During preparation of merit list the <u>reservation of seats under different</u> <u>categories will be given due weightage</u>. The selected students will be informed about the last date of admission by notification in the institution website. After the last date of admission so informed, no further request for admission will be entertained.

As per the Govt. of Assam reservation policy some seats are reserved for OBC/MOBC, SC, ST(P) and ST(H) categories as follows:

(a) Scheduled Caste 7 %

(b) Scheduled Tribes (Plains) 10%

(c) Scheduled Tribes (Hills) 5 %

(d) OBC & MOBC 15 %

#### (e) EWS 10%

A Maximum of 5 % of seats is also earmarked for outstanding sports persons / NCC cadets/applicants with proficiency in cultural activities / wards of the employee of the institution etc. The breakup as per government circular is as follows:

- (a) 2% for sports persons of sports recognised by IOA/SAI and
- (b) Also, for those who have represented District/State/Country.
- (c) 1% for wards of employees of the institution and
- (d) 1% for NCC/Scouts & Guides.
- (e) 1% for the student with achievement in cultural activities

3% of the total seats will kept reserved for differently able (person with disabilities) students as per Govt. of Assam norms.

A candidate is eligible to take admission under EWS quota on production of a valid certificate from competent authority. The soft copy of the EWS certificate has to be uploaded at the time of online fill up of admission form.

These seats are settled on the basis of merit list of students concerned in each category.

No discretionary quota of seats is filled up by any authority in the institution.

No seats are offered for admission by the RTU authorities against donation to the institution fund. The students selected must get themselves admitted on the scheduled date of admission notified by the RTU in the institute notice board / website. Otherwise, their claims for admission will be forfeited.

Students from Boards or Universities other than AHSEC and G.U shall have to produce **Migration Certificate** to the RTU office whenever asked for.

There will be restriction of subject combinations applied for. Due to limitation of seats the combination of subjects opted by a candidate may not be allowed.

Minimum % of marks required in the Higher Secondary Final Examination to be eligible for applying for admission in the:

- 1. B.A. 1st Year class: 45%
- 2. B.Com. 1st Year class: 45%
- 3. B.Sc. 1st Year class: 50%

Please note that the above mentioned % of marks are only the eligibility criteria of **applying for admission**. The admission in the different courses will be strictly on the basis of merit and availability of seats (*see page no. 18*) against a particular course.

#### **Gap Certificate**:

A candidate must have passed the Higher Secondary Final Examination in **2021 or later** in order to be eligible to apply for admission to UG courses. The completed application (format of which is provided below), must be submitted in at the time of admission if the Higher Secondary passing year of the candidate is 2021, 2022, or 2023.

#### This will be treated as a gap certificate.

A copy of the same should be uploaded to the SAMARTH admission portal at the time of online form submission.

#### Library

The Central Library of Rabindranath Tagore University (erstwhile Hojai College) is playing an important role in development and progress of the institution. The library is housed at the centre of the campus, easily accessible from all the departments and is a good repository of diverse information resources with a collection of more than 37000 text and reference books which contributes to the effective teaching-learning and research curriculum. It subscribes to a considerable number of newspapers, journals and periodicals. In addition to the collection of e-books, the user members have access to the eresources of N-List project under the UGC – INFONET consortium. It has access to the web-based plagiarism detection software under the Shodh Shuddhi initiative of INFLIBNET. Apart from acquisition, processing, circulation, reference & internet sections, the library also runs a reprography section to help the user members in getting the photocopies of study materials at a subsidised rate. Library membership of a member or user shall be valid till she/he remains on the role of the University. Visiting scholars/researches from other institutions may also enrol as members of the central library under certain conditions and regulations. However, all the user members need to abide by the rules and regulations of the library

#### **Students' Uniform**

- j) Indulging in any strike, picketing, *hartal* and hunger strike of any kind.
- k) Any notice pasted or circulated in the university campus without the approval of the concerned authority.
- l) Violation of any other rule framed by the authority from time to time for maintaining discipline in the university.
- m) It is mandatory to note that use of cell phone by the students on the plinth area of the university is strictly prohibited. If any student found using the cell phone within said area the following actions may be taken by the authority.
  - \* If found for the first time the cell phone shall be ceased and will be handed over the father or mother of student on payment of a fine of Rs.500.
  - \*If found for the second time the cell phone shall be ceased permanently.
- n) Possession of cell phone in the examination hall shall lead to expulsion from examination.
